Catbird, Grey	Squeaks, gurgles, whistles. Mimic. rarely repeats phrases > 1x	Raspy, cat like mew
Cardinal, Northern	Cheer, cheer, cheer!	Purty, purty, purty
Chickadee, Black-capped	Fee-bee	chickadee-dee-dee
Goldfinch, American	Long variable set of warbles and twitters	potato chip, potato chip
Grosbeak, Rose-breasted	Robin with voice lessons	call is a metallic chink
Mockingbird, Northern	Mimic . . repeats phrases 2-6 times	
Nuthatch, Red-breasted	ink, ink, ink (sounds like a tin horn)	
Nuthatch, White-breasted	Yank, yank, yank	
Oriole, Baltimore	Short series of paired notes	
Owl, Barred	who cooks for you, who cooks for you all?	Hoo-Aah!
Pewee, Eastern Wood	Slurred pee-a-wee	
Phoebe, Eastern	Feebee, fee-blee	
Robin, American	Cheerily, cheer up, cheer up!	Tuk!
Sparrow, Chipping	mechanical fast trill	
Sparrow, Song	Madge, Madge, put on your tea kettle-lettle-lettle	
Sparrow, White-throated	poor Sam Peabody, Peabody, . .	
Tanager, Scarlet	A robin with a sore throat	Chick-burr
Thrush, Hermit	Flute like. Begins with single note whistle	Screy! Or Chuck!
Thrush, Swainson's	Upward spiraling flute-like melody	Pit (like a leaky faucet)
Thrush, Wood	flute-like "eee-oh-lay"	
(Thrush) Veery	descending veer veer veer veer	Veer !
Titmouse, Tufted	Peter, peter, peter	Nasal and mechanical call
Vireo, Blue-headed	See you, be-seeing ya, so long	
Vireo, Red-eyed	here I am, over here, vireo	
Warbler, Black and White	wheezy, wheezy, wheezy, wheezy	
Warbler, Blackburnian	High pitched . . . zee zee zee tititi zeeee	
Warbler, Black-throated Blue	A descending, "beer, beer, beer, beer"	I am so lazeeee
Warbler, Black-throated Green	trees trees, murmuring trees	Zee, zee, zee, zoo zee
Warbler, Chestnut-sided	pleased pleased pleased to meet ya!	
Warbler, Ovenbird	Teacher, teacher, teacher!	
Warbler, Northern Parula	zeeee-up	
Warbler, Common Yellowthroat	witchety, witchety, witchety	
Warbler, Yellow-rumped	variable trill	
Woodpecker, Downy	High pitched notes that descend at end	Pick!
Woodpecker, Hairy	Similar to downy, but does not descend	Peek!
Woodpecker, Pileated	Wuk, wuk, wuk (similar to flicker)	
(Woodpecker) Flicker, Northern	Wicka, wicka, wicka (similar to pileated)	Clear!
Wren, Winter	Long, rapid stream of clear notes
